


Chapter 3 - Tuning using a tuner

Turn the tuning peg so that the note is in tune. The strings should be the following pitches :

1 (lowest) = E 2 = A 3 = D 4 = G 5 = B 6 (highest) = E

Guitar Finger Diagram:



- T = Thumb 1 = Index Finger 2 = Middle 3 = Ring Finger
- 4 = Pinky

Chapter 4 - The "C" Chord $X 3 2 \bigcirc 1 \bigcirc$






- * Keep your left thumb on the back of the neck
- * Keep your left hand in a rounded shape, as if holding a tennis ball
- * Press firmly on each string to make a clean, pure tone. If you don't press the string firmly enough, it will "rattle" against the fret
- * Use a medium pick at first and get used to playing with it
- * Don't play the lowest string. The x in the diagram means "don't play that string".

Chapter 6 - The "G" Chord (Basic Position)




Muting: Causing a string not to play by gently touching it so it will not resonate

Exercise 1 - Play the G and C chords, 4 strums at a time. Each "/" indicates a down stroke with your pick in a steady rhythm.

Minor chords sound darker than major chords

Anchoring Notes: a common note (and fingering) between two chords played in sequence







Voicing: The way in which a chord is played on the fretboard



Strum Pattern: (The actual rhythm)

This is what it feels like with your arm in the up down motion...

CAPOS ARE YOUR FRIEND.

You can play songs in new keys with the same chords you just learned - just use a capo to adjust the key

Key you want to play in	Capo at this fret	Play in this key
F	1	E
F# / Gb	2	E
G	3	E
G# / Ab	4	E
A	5 or no capo	E or play in A
Eb	1	D
Db	1	C
Bb	3	G
